



Nine Job Training Fund grants were awarded in August to upgrade the skills of 222 workers in New Hampshire companies.

The grants total \$152,564.50 and are matched by a similar investment by the employers for a total of \$305,129 in new training programs.

The awards for February include:

- American Machining Solutions LLC of Center Barnstead received a grant award of up to \$4,250 for training 21 employees at the ISO 9001:2015 Training Collaborative from the NH Manufacturing Extension Partnership (NHMEP).
- KT&T Distributors of Nashua, will utilize its grant award of \$1,297.50 to train 3 workers in OSHA 10 training for construction from the OSHA Training Institute Training Center in Keene.
- Bond Optics LLC of Lebanon will have 10 workers trained in AS9100 Quality Management by NHMEP.
- North East Precision of Dover received a matching grant of \$9,250 which will be used in training 15 employees in ISO 9001:2015 and Lean Principles by NHMEP; and JobBOSS Software training by Unipoint.
- Vention Medical Advanced Components, Inc. of Salem received a grant award for up to \$10,830 for training 14 employees in Leadership and Supervision from Manchester Community College (MCC).
- C&J Bus Lines of Portsmouth will train 5 workers in Leadership and Supervisory Skills with training provided by UNH.
- Blue Dolphin Screenprint, Inc. of Somersworth received a \$3,594 grant for providing Frontline Supervision training from Great Bay Community College.
- Sig Sauer Inc. of Newington will train 24 employees in their CNC Boot Camp and up to another 36 workers in Supervisor Training from Great Bay Community College (GBCC).
- Kollsman Inc. of Merrimack received a \$50,000 training grant for training 100 employees in Continuous Improvement and Lean Training from Nashua Community College; and Quality Management System Auditor Training from ASQ.

The Job Training Fund has awarded \$9,982,149 in grants since October 2007, with employers contributing \$12,801,722 for a total of \$22,422,424 in new training for 132 New Hampshire workers.
